

# The Europeana network of Ancient Greek and Latin Epigraphy (EAGLE) and Linked Open Data

The Europeana network of Ancient Greek and Latin Epigraphy aims to provide historians and the general public with a curated online multi-text edition which has high quality contents and related contents as well as high quality data in multiple interoperable formats. Linked Open Data principles aim at bringing things together so we have tried to follow those guidelines. EAGLE considered two standards: TEI – EpiDoc and CIDOC CRM and we work towards tools to facilitate wilful alignment as well as coordinated linking via third parties annotations or through the alignment to common vocabularies (of contents), gazetteers and bibliographies.

**What is EAGLE?**

EAGLE, the Europeana network of Ancient Greek and Latin Epigraphy, is a best-practice network, financed by the European Commission, under the ICT policy of its Competitiveness and Innovation Programme (CIP - ICT PSP).


EAGLE will provide a single, user-friendly portal to the inscriptions of the Ancient World, a massive resource for both the curious and the scholars.

The EAGLE Best Practice Network is part of Europeana, the European digital library - a multilingual online collection of millions of digitised items from European museums, libraries, archives and multi-media collections.

EAGLE is collecting, in a single, readily-searchable database, more than 1.5 million items, currently scattered across 25 EU countries, as well as the east and south Mediterranean.

The project will make available the vast majority of the surviving inscriptions of the Greco-Roman world, complete with the essential information about them and, for all the most important ones, a translation.

The technology that supports EAGLE is state-of-the-art and tailored to provide the user with the



**best and most intuitive possible experience.** Our services include a mobile application, enabling tourists to understand the inscriptions they find on location by taking snapshots with their smartphones, and a storytelling application that will allow teachers and experts to assemble epigraphy-based narratives.

A multilingual wiki is also being set up for the enrichment and enhancement of epigraphic images and texts. This will provide a base for future translations of inscriptions into other European languages. The results of the EAGLE project will be disseminated as widely as possible, within the scholarly community, as well as amongst the public at large. To this end, EAGLE will publish its own Wikimedia Commons, and will also develop an inscription-themed documentary with a related lesser video.

EAGLE is working with Europeana, and with its sister projects, to ensure full and effective integration within this flagship project that is making European culture globally available to everyone.

### What Have the Romans Ever Mapped for Us? Results from the Latin Geographic Tradition

Having recently completed our first content workpackage (CWP1), dedicated to Early Geospatial Documents from the Latin Tradition, we'd like to take this opportunity to share the annotation data that we've compiled so far. Overall we have completed annotating place references in 33 documents (41 if we include additional language versions of the same document). Within these documents, we've identified 19,880 toponyms, and were able to establish mappings to Pleiades in 15,721 cases (79%).

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

### What is EAGLE?

EAGLE, the Europeana network of Ancient Greek and Latin Epigraphy, is a best-practice network financed by the European Commission, under the ICT policy of its Competitiveness and Innovation Programme (CIP - ICT PSP). EAGLE will provide a single, user-friendly portal to the inscriptions of the Ancient World, a massive resource for both the curious and the scholarly.

The EAGLE Best Practice Network is part of Europeana, the European digital library - a multilingual online collection of millions of digitised items from European museums, libraries, archives and multi-media collections.

EAGLE is collecting, in a single readily-searchable database, more than 1.5 million items, currently scattered across 25 EU countries, as well as the east and south Mediterranean.

The project will make available the vast majority of the surviving inscriptions of the Greco-Roman world, complete with the essential information about them and, for all the most important ones, a translation.

The technology that supports EAGLE is state-of-the-art and tailored to provide the user with the

best and most intuitive possible experience.

Our services include a mobile application, enabling tourists to understand the inscriptions they find on location by taking snapshots with their smartphones, and a storytelling application that will allow teachers and experts to assemble epigraphy-based narratives.

A multilingual wiki is also being set up for the enrichment and enhancement of epigraphic images and texts. This will provide a basis for future translations of inscriptions into other European languages. The results of the EAGLE project will be disseminated as widely as possible, within the scholarly community, as well as amongst the public at large. To this end, EAGLE will publish its own Wikimedia Commons, and will also develop an inscription-themed documentary with a related teaser video.

EAGLE is working with Europeana, and with its sister projects, to ensure full and effective integration within this flagship project that is making European culture globally available to everyone.
